

BBC Young Reporters of the Year 2021 - Me and My World

Congratulations to OT Ben Radcliffe on being selected as one of the BBC's Young Reporters of the Year 2021, announced in March.

More than 2,500 young people aged 11-18 submitted their story ideas with the chance to make their own story with BBC programme teams, producers and reporters. There were three categories to choose from: Me and My World, Coronavirus Stories and Uplifting Stories.

30 winners from across the UK were chosen to produce their reports with the help of some of the BBC's programme-makers and producers. Judges included editors from across the BBC as well as presenters and reporters, including Huw Edwards, Laura Kuenssberg, and Nikki Fox from BBC News, Radio 1's Greg James and Katie Thistleton, The One Show's Alex Jones, BBC Newsbeat's Roisin Hastie and Ben Mundy, Newsround's Ricky Boleto and BBC Three reporter Ellie Flynn.

Ben won the 'Me and My World' (16-18 years) category with his story "The experience of being an apprentice footballer at a professional club."

Having left Trent in 2020 to pursue a career as an apprentice footballer,

with a scholarship at the Burton Albion Academy, Ben's report highlighted just how vital mental health awareness is, in football.

In his BBC video Ben talks about the challenges of leaving school, and his friends, after 12 years to play football.


"If you don't make it as a pro, it's a big step to take. I wanted to highlight the importance of the mental health side of football."

He continues to talk about the rigorous weekly routine of an academy footballer; balancing a Monday to Saturday programme of training, college and tactical video sessions "getting up early and going home late, it's hard."

Director of Sport at Trent College, Richard Mahony says "Ben is a very talented sportsman. He played rugby, hockey and cricket for the school, representing at two National Cricket finals."

He continued "He always showed leadership skills and we wish him the very best of luck as he pursues his footballing dream. He's a very positive role model for the Trent College and Old Trident community and we wish him the very best of luck".

Students receive insight into rapid growth business as a result of COVID-19

Trent's Academic Forum members recently had the opportunity to hear OT David Campbell (class of 2008) speak about his diagnostic testing business, Surescreen Diagnostics Ltd.

It was fascinating for the students to hear about the phenomenal growth of the business over the COVID 19 crisis, due to its development of the rapid COVID-19 lateral flow antigen tests. The tests display results visually in under 10 minutes allowing an individual to determine whether they currently have the virus. They were contracted to the UK Government in its campaign to roll out rapid testing in hospitals, schools, nursing homes and businesses.



David talked about his career path and the learning curve the Derbyshire based business had to follow, to expand so rapidly in response to market demands.

The students and staff at Trent were very grateful to David for taking time out of his busy schedule.



In the same week, Charles Hardy (class of 1992) Education Partner at LinkedIn, led a Year 13 PSHE lesson and demonstrated the powerful networking and professional development capabilities of the platform. He also talked about the research opportunities LinkedIn presented regarding career development and the use of the wider network of connections. 




Celebrating 10 Years of the Devonshire Library

In March, Trent College celebrated the 10-year anniversary since the opening of the Devonshire Library, by Professor Germaine Greer. The Devonshire library is one of the oldest parts of the school, originally used as the dining hall before being sensitively adapted into a 21st Century library. Remaining on proud display is the Propeller belonging to Old Trident and WWI flying ace Captain Albert Ball.

The former 'Warner Library' now known as The Warner, which was built 'by the boys for the boys' in 1929 under the watchful guidance and instruction of Daddy Warner (Revd. Captain G J S Warner), maintains its original features and today is a learning space for pupils studying Computer Science.








Other anniversaries to note this year include:

- 100 years since the WW1 Chapel Memorial was unveiled, and dedicated by Lt.Gen. Sir Ivor Maxse K.C.B, C.V.O. in a special Chapel Service.
- 100 years since Seni Pramoj, a former Prime Minister of Thailand, and his brother T Pramoj, became the first Thai pupils to arrive at Trent.
- 50 years since the Science Building was opened for teaching, officially opened in September 1972 by His Grace The Duke of Devonshire P.C.M.C. Science was previously taught in The Kelvin, Trent's first purpose-built Science facility, opened in 1923.
- 40 years since the opening of Blake Boarding House, with Ken Pye as first Housemaster.

Trent Young Musician of the Year 2021

There was special poignancy to the competition this year, held in the School Chapel on the evening of Friday 21 May, as it was the first musical performance at Trent in front of a live audience for 14 months! Audience members lucky enough to have been able to obtain tickets were seated in socially distanced bubbles, with the Chapel operating at less than 50% capacity to safely accommodate everyone.

Trent was delighted to welcome, as competition adjudicator, Old Trident Helen Brackenbury (class of 2009), a Mezzo Soprano, Royal Academy of Music BMus and MA graduate and, recipient of the Academy's Opera Diploma.





Helen had a tough job in decision making. She said, "It was so lovely to come back [to Trent] and hear all the young talent. I really had not anticipated it being that difficult! It was a real pleasure."

She told Director of Music, Chris Foster "I still always rave to everyone about how Trent was a massively supportive school in encouraging its students to pursue whatever they excelled in."

Each competition winner received a trophy, with the overall champion having his name engraved on the Claret Jug, proudly displayed in the school's trophy cabinet for all to see.

Chris said, "All of the performers deserve congratulating. They did exceptionally well; especially considering the time elapsed since their last live performances."

Thank you so much to Helen for her giving her time to this event and for being such an inspiring role model to all Trent musicians.

As a soloist, Helen has performed in a number of London's leading venues, including Wigmore Hall, St Martin-in-the-Fields and St Paul's Cathedral. She has taken roles with a number of opera companies, including Opera Holland Park and Longborough Festival Opera.

The standard of performance was exceptional. 69 entrants had their video performances considered by an external adjudicator and 12 finalists from across the entire range of the senior school were selected, each receiving a music retailer voucher.

There were four prizes on offer; Lower School, won by Jacob (Year 7) on Piano; Main School, won by Nathan (Year 11) on Tuba; Sixth Form, won by Alice (Year 13) with Voice and overall 'Trent Young Musician of the Year' being awarded to Nathan for his outstanding performance with the Tuba.
