CONGRATULATIONS



We were delighted to receive the news that **Chris Hill** (class of 2016) has recently been awarded his 8th Music Fellowship, having achieved a Liturgical Fellowship with Honours.

Chris received his first Fellowship at 16, his second at 19, subsequently reaching his 8th by the age of 23, which is an extremely rare achievement. His' father Malcolm told us "Chris's experience at Trent helped shape the musician he is today".

We will be talking to Chris in the coming weeks about his achievements, his enjoyment of performing and his aspirations for the future and look forward to bringing you an in-depth interview soon.

Liam Bishop (class of 2019) made his league debut for Nottingham RFC earlier this month, against Hartpury, in the Championship. A Nottingham Trent University Sports Scholar, Liam was also selected last summer to play in the Under 20's Six Nations Rugby Tournament, representing Ireland.





CONGRATULATIONS



Professor **Tony Avery** (former Governor 2006-2016) for his recognition in the Queen's New Year Honours. A GP and Professor of Primary Healthcare, and a Senior Investigator for the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR), Tony received the award for his 'Services to General Practice'.

His research focuses on patient safety in primary care, which is a priority area for the NHS, and he has led ground-breaking studies to identify the frequency, nature and cause of prescribing errors and avoidable harm in primary care. He has developed and evaluated a range of interventions that have led to improvements in patient safety and which have been rolled out to 350 general practices in the East Midlands and which has been recommended for national adoption by the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence, in 2015. Subsequently, his pharmacist led information technology based intervention (PINCER) has been rolled out to over 2,500 general practices across England, benefiting over 20,000 patients with safer prescriptions.

"I'm absolutely delighted to receive this honour, and thank my wife, Chris, and children (Old Tridents, Rob and Izzy Avery-Phipps, class of 2009 & 2015) for their love and support.

I also want to say how much I have appreciated my association with Trent College as a parent, Chair of the Parents Social Association, and as a Governor, and I wish the School every success in the future."

Professor Avery has worked in the medical field for over 35 years and has received several prestigious awards throughout his career. He was appointed as the Director of Research for the School of Medicine at Nottingham in 2013 and was Dean and Head of Nottingham School of Medicine from 2015-2019. Professor Avery also works as a GP at a practice in Chilwell, Nottinghamshire.

An Order of the British Empire was also honoured to Old Trident (Hanbury 1953-57) and former Governor (1987-2001) **Tony Swallow** for services to young people and the community in Cheshire and abroad.

Tony has a long history of supporting his community through philanthropy and together with his wife Helga set up The Swallow Trust in 2006, with the aim of helping young people in East Cheshire and Macclesfield with education and employment opportunities, and to support their mental health. Tony's spirit of philanthropy has also made a significant impact on the Trent community, by his generous support of pupil bursaries and improved facilities.

"It's been a privilege to have the opportunity to give back to the community in this way and I'm immensely proud of the incredible things the charities we've worked with over the years have achieved and the real difference they have made to young people's lives."






"EVERY THEATRE KIDS DREAM, RIGHT"!



We had the privilege of sitting down with Kris, the second longest serving member of staff (after Revd 'Daddy' Warner 1901-1964) in the school's history, to talk about her memories of working at Trent over a coffee in the recently refurbished Common Room lounge 'The Berry Suite'.

Kris has held several roles over the years, from Admin Clerk and Bursar's Secretary to Services Manager. For many years, Kris was also OT Society Secretary "Each job has it's own happy place with me, but the OTs was the most interesting one, so many different people I got to know over the years and certainly the most rewarding."


