

SCHOOL ARCHIVES





It is a pleasure to introduce Rosemary Dobbin as Volunteer Archivist. Rosemary will assist Archivist David Pinney in organising the School's new archive room.

They begin with sorting through all the school's historic sporting memorabilia, of which there is a vast amount and which requires its own dedicated room. Rosemary is the daughter of Rutherford Ikin, Trent College Headmaster 1936-1968. She spent her childhood living and playing in the grounds of Trent College.

"I have fond memories of running through the grounds and climbing the trees".

Rosemary met up with David a few years ago, at the Trent College 1960s Reunion event "We got talking about wanting to locate the Chapel Foundation Stone ... from there, I became interested in researching the history of the school".

Over the course of the Pandemic, Rosemary and David stayed in touch and as soon as it was possible to consider working on the new archive facility, with the help of the Alumni Office, Rosemary joined the school as Volunteer Archivist.

David said, "I am delighted Rosemary offered to spend time volunteering, it has been nice to talk about former staff members we both knew, and general memories of both of our school days".

Rosemary spent her first day wading through piles of photographs and sports equipment "It is very interesting being shown around the archive facility, there is so much material. It is good to be able to focus on making a start with the various sporting items".

There will be more archive news to share as the new room starts to take shape.







Archive enquires continue to arrive into the Alumni Office. This month we have had the pleasure of assisting with research on behalf of the grandson of Arthur Beaumaris Clark, a pupil at Trent College 1878-1924 and have been looking back at the history of the Chapel Organ, built and installed by Church & Company (Northumberland) in 1976.



IN MEMORIAM



Old Trident **Forbes Robertson Mutch**, a student at Trent College (Wright House 1940-1944) and prior to that a pupil at Bramcote Preparatory School (1935-1940), passed away on 17 January 2022 aged 94 years. Beloved husband of Pat, loved by all his family and friends, he will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

Many members of the Trent College and Bramcote Prep community will remember Forbes with fond memory. He attended a Centenary Remembrance Service held at Trent College in 2014 and the following year reunited with friends for the Old Bramcotian Reunion event.

To celebrate his life and recognise his contribution to the wider civic life of Nottingham his family will be holding a public Memorial Service at 11:00 on Friday 8 April 2022 at St Jude's Church, Mapperley with light refreshments served afterwards in the adjacent Church Hall.

His family warmly invite anyone who knew Forbes to attend the service.
