Our Location

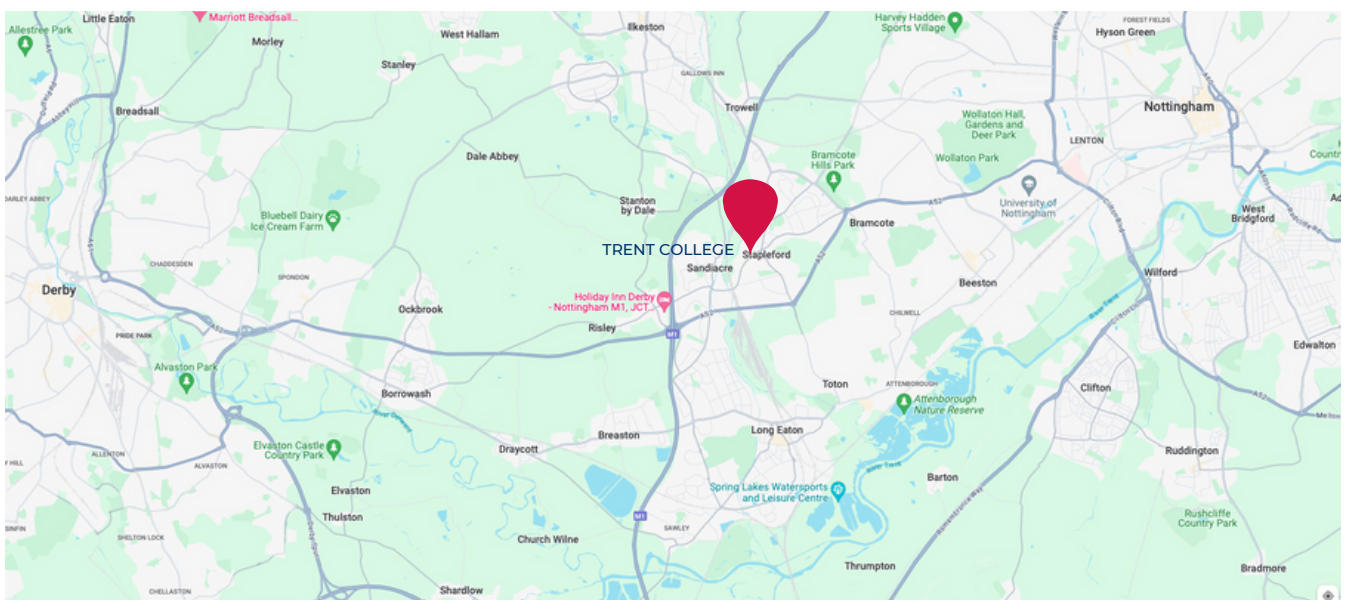
Trent College and The Elms are conveniently situated on the border of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire.

Ideally located at the heart of the UK's motorway system, we are only 2 miles from junction 25 of the M1, which provides easy access to the M42 and A1.

Reaching Trent College by rail couldn't be easier. Long Eaton boasts its own train station, located 1.5 miles from the schools. Rail routes through Long Eaton run along the Midlands Main Line route, with direct routes to London, Loughborough, Leicester, Birmingham, Nottingham, Derby, Chesterfield and Sheffield.

Job Description

REQUIRED FROM SEPTEMBER 2024

The person appointed will join a strong team of experienced teachers of Chemistry supported by a full-time laboratory technician and led by an experienced Head of Chemistry. Whilst the Head of Chemistry oversees the Department, some responsibilities are shared amongst members of the Department.

We require a good teacher of Chemistry to join this excellent. The new appointee will be expected to teach a Combined Science course in Year 7 and/or 8 and Chemistry from 9 upwards. The ability to teach Physics and/or Biology up to GCSE would be welcomed.

Chemistry is taught in a dedicated Science Centre, with refurbished laboratories, a project room and bookable IT suite.

Pupils in years 7 and 8 follow a combined science course that covers key topics in the 3 main sciences. In years 9, 10 and 11 all pupils take either three separate Science subjects or a Double Award (Science) course.

Chemistry is a popular subject at A-Level. All members of the Department can teach the A Level course and there is a large amount of experience within the department.

PASTORAL CARE

- In addition to the academic role, every teacher is encouraged to play a full role in the life of the School outside the classroom.
- Teachers are expected to attend and support regular school events, including but not limited to assemblies, drama productions, religious services, concerts and speech days.

ADDITIONAL DUTIES

- This is not an exhaustive job description and may be subject to change according to the needs and development of the role. It is expected that the post holder may undertake such other duties as may be reasonably be requested.
- A Trent teacher is dedicated to educating the "whole child", in accordance with the aims of the school.
- They are aware of the individual needs of each student and strive to help each student develop his or her full potential.
- They work with students both inside and outside the classroom and are committed to active involvement in the total school curriculum.
- They co-operate with colleagues to ensure a fully integrated curriculum and regularly participate in activities directed toward their own professional development.
- A Trent College teacher is always available to students, colleagues, and administration during the entire school day. In the time other than that scheduled for lunch, a teacher may be assigned activities such as supervision, tutorial, class coverage, etc. by the Head/ Deputy Head.

- Proven experience in teaching science at Key Stage 3 and Chemistry at GCSE and Advanced Level
- Alternatively, the experience within the department means that we will be able to provide support to a teacher who has the capability to teach up to A Level but has not yet had the opportunity to do so. This may include Early Careers Teachers and we have a successful Early Careers programme to support these teachers.
- Ability and willingness to contribute to the development and enhancement of the Chemistry curriculum.
- Experience in creating engaging lesson plans and resources for students of varying abilities.
- Proficient in conducting practical experiments and demonstrations, ensuring a safe and stimulating learning environment and a capability to guide and support students in developing their practical skills for A level assessments.
- Competence in designing and implementing effective assessment strategies for monitoring student progress.
- Experience in providing constructive feedback to support student improvement.
- Strong classroom management skills to create a positive and conducive learning atmosphere.
- Proficiency in incorporating Information and Communication Technology (ICT) into Chemistry lessons.
- Familiarity with relevant software and tools for enhancing teaching and learning.
- Effective communication skills with students, colleagues, and parents/guardians.
- Willingness to collaborate with other teachers and contribute to the broader school community.
- A genuine passion for the subject and a commitment to instilling a love of Chemistry in students.
- Enthusiasm for co-curricular activities related to Chemistry, such as science clubs or field trips.
